The Lecture will be delivered by the NFUs Senior Policy Adviser Clare Greener, who will present to you highlights from her recent Nuffield Scholarship of which her subject was "Achieving agricultural policies to meet global challenges"

Originally from Northumberland, Clare now lives in South Shropshire with her partner Andrew on his family's dairy farm. Clare studied Agriculture with Food Marketing at Newcastle-upon-Tyne University and came to Shropshire over twenty years ago to work for the Potato Marketing Board.

Following the reorganisation of the Potato Board, Clare went on to work for Harper Adams University College where she delivered a research project seeking opportunities for lifelong learning within the land based sector. The results of this study were used as the foundation of the college's short course provision.

Following the successful completion of this research, Clare then diverted her energies to

agricultural and rural policy development working for a number of different public sector agencies including the Rural Development Commission.

During this time Clare was responsible for the representation of local agricultural and rural communities with regards to local, regional and national policy development. For the past 10 years Clare has also been heavily involved in the roll out of rural development programmes in terms of both programme and project development and management. Clare joined the National Farmers' Union three years ago where she is now the West Midlands Senior Policy Adviser. Clare was awarded a Nuffield Farming Scholarship in January 2010 and as a result has travelled extensively throughout the United States, Canada, China, Ireland and New Zealand. Her subject "Achieving agricultural policies to meet global challenges" identifies areas for development and action under the headings of next generation leadership, public influence and avoiding unintended consequences.
