Spring marks the start of lambing season in the UK, but the physically-demanding task of sheep shearing generally takes place between May and July.

12 Fascinating Facts about Sheep Shearing

- **1.** Britain's 31 million sheep produce around 30 million kilos of fleece wool per year.
- **2.** Clipping takes place between July and September in the Lake District. In warmer parts of Britain, shearing begins in May.
- **3.** Hiring a professional shearer charge about £1 per sheep.
- **4.** It takes around 6 to 8 weeks for a fleece to grow back enough to protect the sheep from cold weather
- **5.** Shearing should be carried out on a clean, dry surface
- **6.** Sheep shearers need to be highly skilled so they don't injure the sheep
- 7. A typical fleece weighs 1.5-10kg
- **8.** Back in 2004, Shrek the Merino sheep hid in a cave for six years so he wouldn't have to get sheared. But the time he was cornered and given his long-overdue haircut on New Zealand national television, there was enough

- **9.** A highly skilled shearer can shear 400-500 per day; an apprentice shearer can do up to 200.
- **10.** The fastest sheep shearer in the world, according to Guinness World Records, is Australian Hilton Barrett, who sheared a sheep in 39.31 seconds in 2010.
- **11.** Sheep will feel uncomfortable if they are not sheared at least once a year
- **12.** A good sheep shearer can shear a sheep in under two minutes
