Always ensure fresh water is available for birds

The importance of high energy seed mix

High energy seed mix is a very versatile seed mixture which is not only designed to feed birds all year round but also to appeal to them in the winter months, especially when weather patterns are unfavourable to wild life and farmlands are bare.

Due to the wide range of seeds included in most seed mixes, this makes it a good attractive meal for attracting many species of wild birds.

The 'Hungry Gap'

This is the period of the year, through the winter months, where most of the seed-bearing crops are in short supply. To be more specific on the definition, scientists at the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) have found that some birds like <u>Yellowhammers</u> and <u>Reed Bunting</u> and many others are already at risk of disappearing from the countryside because they are going hungry between 14th February and the start of nesting in April because most of the 'seed-bearing' crop fields are usually ploughed up at this time of the year under the Environmental Stewardship rules.



High energy mix



Mealworms are the larvae of the Yellow Mealworm Beetle - the adult beetles are shiny dark-brown or black - their larvae are honey-yellow. Dried mealworms retain all this protein and fat but without the wriggle
